- **CORRECTION! 6-8th Grade Mu Alpha Theta (MATH) Meet held at Central:** On Wednesday, 2/28, Mrs. Hubbell and Mrs. Clausing led 16 kids to the high school for a math meet hosted by their Mu Alpha Theta (MATH) club. Our students tackled three rounds: individual, team, and a team activity. The 8th grade emerged victorious, securing first place overall for the team, while the 6th grade snagged second place overall. Additionally, Madison S. clinched first place overall for 8th-grade individual, and Ben E. secured second place overall for 7th grade individual!

Did you know that Bristol School provides two distinct math opportunities for students?

1. **Grades 6-8 Math Meet** offers a more diverse range of challenges. This includes an individual segment along with two additional events, one hands-on and one team-based. Students showcase their proficiency in various mathematical domains such as geometry, algebra, pre-algebra, and real-world applications. To participate in Math Meet, students need to volunteer, undergo placement tests, and/or obtain recommendations from their teachers.
2. **Math 24** is open to students from grades 4 to 7. Participants compete individually, tackling mathematical challenges involving addition, subtraction, multiplication, or division to reach a solution of 24. This fast-paced and enjoyable game is exclusively for students in grades 4 through 7. To participate, students must try out narrowing down to a top 6 and a top 3. The top 3 compete and the rest of the top 6 are alternates.
