#### **Important Reminders:**

- Arrival, Dismissal Drop-Off & Pick Up Information: Visit our <u>Bristol School Home Webpage</u> to review important attendance, arrival and dismissal information. We ask that all parents review the <u>23-24 Drop Off and Pick Up Procedures</u>! Please note that the start of the school day is 7:35am. All students should be in their classes ready to learn at that time. Students arriving after 7:35am will need to be checked in at the school office by their parents and will be considered tardy.
- Fall MAP Growth Testing: This year, *fall* MAP Growth Testing will only take place for certain grade levels/content areas. This decision is to prioritize student learning and to gather the most valuable instructional insights. While MAP Growth is a valuable tool to provide general school trends and individual student progress over time, in some cases, other assessments are available that provide teachers with more actionable information, especially at the start of the school year. All grades will engage in winter and spring MAP Growth assessments. Classroom teachers will communicate with students and families if/when students will be engaging in the MAP Growth assessment.
- Grading System Information for Grades 4-8: Beginning this school year (2023-2024), all classes that report student grades using an A-F letter grade system will consistently have the following two weight categories:

Weighted Category	Definition	Possible examples	% of Reported Grade
Practice/ Formative	Work, activities or assignments that allow students to practice and learn new information.	other class activities, and more	20%
Summativa	Work, activities, or assessments that are completed at specific intervals to measure what students know and are able to do independently after having sufficient time to practice	Tests, projects, presentations, formal quizzes, observations, essays, and more	80%
