- **Student Work From Home Due to Anticipated School Closures Framework:** Due to the exhaustion of this year's inclement weather days, Bristol School will implement work-from-home days when possible to avoid makeup days at the year's end. Families should review the framework for anticipated closures, as the district is dedicated to preparing both staff and students for potential disruptions caused by inclement weather.

Anticipated School Closures - [Student Learn From Home Day](#)

1. The district will communicate during each school closure whether or not students will have a "Learn From Home day".
2. Teachers will communicate with families the best way to contact them for any questions or support needed.
3. Activities and work sent home will serve as our method of taking attendance during the school closure.
4. If your child engages in the activities prepared by the teachers during the school closure, your child will be counted as "present".
5. If your child does not engage in the activities prepared by the teachers during the school closure, your child will be counted as "absent".

- **Bristol School District #1's ACP & Future Readiness Plan:** We are excited to share [Bristol School District's updated Academic & Career Planning \(ACP\) & Future Readiness Plan](#). This plan is updated annually and is designed to help students prepare for future success and is an "ongoing process of implementation, review, evaluation, and refinement as a district implements the components of college and career readiness" (DPI, 2022). - **Pick Up and Drop Off-** Reminder about basic safety practices:
 - a. Stay off your cellphone when navigating drop off and pick up.
 - b. If you need to get out of your vehicle to assist your child, please park in a designated parking spot and avoid getting out of the vehicle in the pick up drop off lane.
 - c. The easternmost entrance to the north parking lot is exit only during pick up and drop off.
 - d. Do not stop and drop students off in the traffic lanes of the parking lot.
 - e. On the 45 side in the interest of safety, students should be picked up at the sidewalk on the south end of the building. Students should not be walking through the parking lot to find their rides.

School Nurse:

- **Important!!** Due to a high number of Norovirus and Flu cases students are not allowed to spend time in the health room for non sickness or urgent injuries. All students are expected to take part in recess unless we have a note from a doctor. If the student does have a doctor's note the office will find a place for the student to spend recess.

- **Mycoplasma Pneumonia Reminders** - The Wisconsin Department of Health Services (DHS) has reported an increase in respiratory illnesses, including Mycoplasma pneumonia, affecting school-age children.
