6TH GRADE EXPLORATORY COURSES

6th Grade Required Exploratory Classes

All 6th grade students will be enrolled in Financial Literacy I and College and Career Prep I.

Students will experiment with creating and managing a budget, real life budgeting scenarios, and learn how to prioritize and set saving goals. Some of the topics students might explore are:

Financial Literacy I:

- Saving Money
- Developing Wise Spending Habits
- Short vs. Long Term Goals
- Borrowing & Paying Back Money
- Income and Expenses

- Gross vs. Net Pay
- Credit Cards vs. Debit Cards
- Credit Scores and Interest Rates
- Following a Budget
- Planning and Smart Decision Making

College & Career Prep I

Students will explore different skills necessary for success in college and the workforce including: time management, organization, planning, actively studying, and note-taking. Additionally, students will learn about positive life-long habits that will set them up for success beyond middle school. Additionally, students will gain experience in using web applications to communicate effectively.

6th Grade Exploratory Choices

Band:

6TH GRADE EXPLORATORY COURSES

These students may also be asked to help support the classroom teacher with various organizational responsibilities.

77H GRADE ENCORE COURSES

7th grade students will automatically be enrolled in physical education AND

MUST select 2 courses from the list below!

General Music:	This course of study is organized around musical styles both familiar and unfamiliar to the students. Styles are studied by region and culture such as current and historic American (folk, blues, jazz, musical theater, popular, etc.), Carnatic, Native American, Japanese among others. This course is an extension of the General Music from 6th grade. There will be an emphasis on rhythm, pitch, harmony, form, tone color, instruments, music history, musical theater, as well as creative means of generating student original selections.
Spanish:	This course aims to help students acquire basic communication skills in both oral and written Spanish. Additionally, students will develop an understanding of different countries and cultures of Spanish speaking people.
Theater Arts:	This course will focus on everything students need to know about the theater in order to appreciate a play or even write, star in, produce or direct one themselves one day! This course has many different units including improvisation, creative writing, monologues, scene study, design and theater production/technical theater. The course will focus on the origins or history of theater, and include some field trip opportunities to go and see high school, collegiate and professional theater productions.
Art:	In this course students will be exposed to a wide variety of art history, materials, and techniques designed to help improve students' basic knowledge of art skills; designing original artwork through drawing, painting, and sculpting. This course is a lot like what you have been part of from Kindergarten.
Band:	Increase musicianship skills while performing a variety of exciting music in many different concerts for our school, community and at competition. Please take a look at the <u>band course overview</u> for more information regarding performances, other band opportunities, and the band progressions through the middle school years.



7th Grade Required Exploratory Classes

All 7th grade students will be enrolled in Financial Literacy II and Health.

Students will explore their money values, learn the basics of banking, saving, and budgeting, and start thinking ahead to high school and their financial futures. Some of the topics students might explore are:

Health:

In this course, students will be introduced to the basic concepts of health and wellness. Students will explore many topics and the factors that will influence their health and wellness, so that we can make health literate decisions regarding living a healthier life.

7th Grade Exploratory Choices

Students in 7th grade will be able to take up to 4 exploratory classes. Please discuss the different options with your child and indicate your preferences through the form on Skyward.

Novel to Hollywood:

We will read two books during the trimester and then watch the movie versions. Students will analyze similarities and differences and express their preferences. Students will also practice having meaningful discussions about why certain changes were made from the book to the movie.

Painting:

In this course students will explore the fundamentals of painting. This course will emphasize proper use of materials and techniques through a variety of subjects: still life, portrait, and landscape. Students will learn basic color mixing, elements and principles of design, and color theory. Emphasis will be on watercolor and acrylic paints.

World Travel through Virtual Field Trips:

Students will engage in virtual field trips to important cultural sites around the world. They will discuss the importance of the sites and discover future places to visit.

Teacher Assistant:	Students who opt to be a teacher assistant will work in a primary classroom supporting teachers. This may include reading to students, providing guidance and support during work centers, playing games, and practicing with students. These students may also be asked to help support the classroom teacher with various organizational responsibilities.
Personal Fitness:	In the personal fitness elective, students will choose to focus on one of two types of fitness: Aerobic or Anaerobic. In the aerobic workouts, students will be performing running workouts and improving their cardiovascular endurance. In the anaerobic workouts, students will be introduced to the principles of basic weight training and will look to improve their muscular strength and endurance. During the course, students will set goals and perform supervised workouts with instructor guidance.
S.T.E.M. I:	This course is intended to integrate the science, technology, engineering, and math fields through project based learning. Students will be engaged by frequent hands-on activities geared towards combining each of the S.T.E.M. disciplines. Creativity and collaboration will be encouraged as students solve problems with a focus on computer science coding.
Cinematography:	Students will learn the basics of video and movie production from conception to finished footage with the end goal of students producing finished footage for promotional use by Bristol School District. Course may require students to commit time after school.
Public Speaking:	This course is designed for students new to public speaking and oral communications. Thus, the course is a scaffolded approach, giving students a foundation in oral communications, principles, and successful experiences with quick speeches in front of the class or in small groups.

STH GRADE ENCORE COURSES

8th grade students will have physical education AND

MUST select 2 courses from the list below

Art:	In this course students will be exposed to a wide variety of art history, materials, and techniques designed to help improve students' basic knowledge of art skills; designing original artwork through drawing, painting, and sculpting. This course is a lot like what you have been part of from Kindergarten.
Band:	Increase musicianship skills while performing a variety of exciting music in many different concerts for our school, community and at competition. The class will also dive into music critics and reviews and song analysis, commercials, and the importance of music.

STH GRADE EXPLORATORY COURSES

8th Grade Required Exploratory Classes

All 8th grade students will be enrolled in College & Career Prep II and Holocaust Studies.

College & Career Prep II:	and college. This will include an emphasis on growing writing, critical thinking, reading, organization and collaboration skills.
Holocaust Studies:	This course provides an age-appropriate introduction to the Holocaust. Students will explore the historical events, key figures, and lasting impact of the Holocaust. Topics will include: the rise of Nazism, the persecution of Jews and other targeted groups, the experience of survivors, and the importance of remembrance. Emphasis will be placed on encouraging empathy, critical thinking, and a commitment to standing up against prejudice and injustice. By the end of the course, students will have a foundational understanding of this critical period in history and its relevance to contemporary society.

Students will learn how to manipulate these materials and use sculpting tools safely to create interesting sculptural art forms both realistic and abstract.	
Cinematography:	Students will learn the basics of video and movie production from conception to finished footage with the end goal of students producing finished footage for promotional use by Bristol School District. Due to the nature of the course, space will be limited.
