Water Bottle/Lunch Drop Off

Effective immediately, Water bottle or Lunch arrivals:

- If a parent drops off a water bottle or lunch, it must be left at the designated "Drop-off Station" in the office. Please know that we value instructional time and we are trying to minimize the time students are pulled out of class. Please note that students will not be pulled from class to collect food, and we cannot guarantee the food will remain at its original temperature.
