

Early Childhood Child Find Screening & Evaluation

Early childhood screenings and evaluations are provided to children ages three to five living within the Bristol School District #1 boundary who may be demonstrating delays in any area of development. As children undergo the screening process, information is gathered about the child's developmental skills in the areas of communication, motor skills, concepts, adaptive skills as well as social/emotional functioning. The information is typically collected through parent interviews, observations, structured activities, and interactions with the child. If a potential delay is identified, an evaluation for special education and related services may be made. Once written consent is obtained for the evaluation, an Individualized Education Program (IEP) team conducts assessments to determine if a child has a disability and requires special education services. Should the IEP team, including the parents/guardians, determine that a child meets the eligibility criteria, an Individualized Education Program (IEP) will be developed.

These services are provided at no cost by the Bristol School District #1 to children living within the district. The upcoming early childhood screening is scheduled for January 13th and April 14th, 2023.
